

Behavior Management

Dear Second Grade Parents,

In order to guarantee your child and all the children in our classroom the excellent learning climate they deserve, our class will be utilizing the following behavior management plan. Your child will have a clip that they will physically move up or down the chart, depending on their behavior choices. Please keep in mind that your child may not move every single day! In order to move up, students must go above and beyond in their behavior choices. The chart below explains how the clip chart works.

Clip Chart	
Purple Role model	Students who reach this level will be rewarded for their positive choices with a raffle ticket. Every Friday we do a raffle drawing, and the winner picks a prize from the treasure bag.
Pink Outstanding	Students who continue to make positive choices move up to the pink level. They are one step closer to becoming a role model for others!
Blue Showing Pride	Students who make positive choices will receive recognition as they move up the chart.
Green Ready to Learn	Everyone starts the day "Ready to Learn"! Students can "clip up" or "clip down" throughout the day depending on their behavior choices.
Yellow Think about it	Students who receive a warning will move to yellow. This serves as a reminder to students to think about the choices they make.
Orange Teacher's Choice	Students who continue to make poor choices, will move to orange. This will result in a consequence that is appropriate for the choice that was made. Consequences will vary depending on the choices made (Loss of privilege, loss of playtime, writing an apology letter).
Red Parent contact/office	Students who move to red will require parental contact by me. Parents will be contacted via telephone, email or note depending on the severity of the behavioral choice.

Each day your child will mark the color that she/he has ended the day with. I ask that you check your child's Behavior Calendar (inside their binder) each day and initial it so I know that you have seen your child's conduct grade.
