

- Andy was the star of his baseball team.


 Liz was his twin sister.

"Let's go!"




- Andy threw the ball to Liz. She hit it easily.

 But then the score was tied.




- Now it was the last inning.

- Andy ran to catch it. He caught the ball, but he fell back.




- The coach ran to see if Andy was okay.

"I know," said Andy.


"I'm not just her twin.
