




More than anything else, Jack loved to sing. He went to the School of Music and Art. There, teachers taught him how to sing and how to draw.

Jack wanted to be a singer. He did not think about being a poet.





Often, Jack's ideas come from his life. He likes to eat spaghetti, so one poem is about





- Jack's poems are sometimes silly and sometimes scary, but they are always fun to read. Children like to read his books. So do grownups. Sometimes parents and children read Jack's books together.



Because many people like Jack's poems, he sometimes wins prizes. In 2006, he won an important prize. The prize was for writing great poems for children.
