The same morning, Raj woke up. He looked for his sneakers. Raj saw his sneakers under the bed.



- "I can help," said Mekea.


 "Will you climb the tree?" the boy asked.

are you?"




- Diana asked, "What's wrong?"

"Yes, we can," said Mekea.


The friends said goodnight. They all went home. They thought about the next day. Would they have super powers again tomorrow? Maybe, or maybe not. . . .
