


A king had three sons. The sons were named Oscar, Juan, and Carlos. The king said his sons must not leave the castle.

"Carlos!" said his brother Juan. "Come down! Father will get mad at you!"






The King was very angry at Carlos.

He turned the three brothers into three rabbits!


"You will be rabbits every day," said the King. "Then at night you will turn back into princes."

Then Carlos heard a song. He wanted to know who was singing. Carlos followed the sound.




Carlos saw a beautiful yard. A woman sang in the yard. Carlos listened to the song.





"I will not marry the other Princess," Carlos said. "I will marry Marisol!"

Carlos did not want to marry the other princess.






Princess Marisol went to the castle. She wanted to stop the wedding!






