


- One Sunday, Evan sat at the table doing his homework. Grandpa sat next to him with the newspaper. He looked upset.

"Yes, please!" said Evan.



The game was exciting! At the end of the game, both teams had the same score. They spent more, or extra, time playing, and then the Mets won! Everyone cheered loudly.




"Today was great!" said Evan. "Let's go on our trip soon."

- "Look! The Green Monster!" said Evan.


The Green Monster was a tall green wall on one side of the field. "I'm having fun, Grandpa!"

Grandpa smiled.






"That sounds great!" said Grandpa.
